



ResearcherID

The IOCB Director instructs all the staff publishing their research results and not having their ResearcherID to create it in the Web of Science by **June 16, 2014** at the latest. Since 2014, this number must be listed with all authors of a record entered in the ASEP (RIV) register. Publication reviewers, grant agencies etc. will thus be able clearly to connect publication outputs with a specific author regardless of his/her workplace, a name change, name agreement, diacritics etc.

Announce your researcher ID to your group leader, who will submit the numbers for the entire group in the library or send them to janap@uochb.cas.cz by **June 30, 2014**. The group leaders will ensure that all new employees at the IOCB who publish their work will announce their ResearcherID to the above-mentioned address. If an IOCB does not do so, his/her publication may not be entered in the ASEP (RIV) and will thus not be evaluated.

NB:

- a) Remember whether you have acquired a ResearcherID yet – you cannot have two numbers.
- b) In the basic form of your last name and first name, do not use diacritics – list the name with the diacritics as another possible form of your name.
- c) After you have received the number, verify all the records that are listed as your publication and keep updating the file.
- d) Continuously add other possible variants of your name – e.g. women's married names etc.

The IOCB director requires that the name of our institution used when creating ResearcherID and listing the affiliation be: **Institute of Organic Chemistry and Biochemistry, Academy of Sciences of the Czech Republic**.
