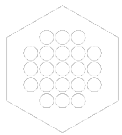

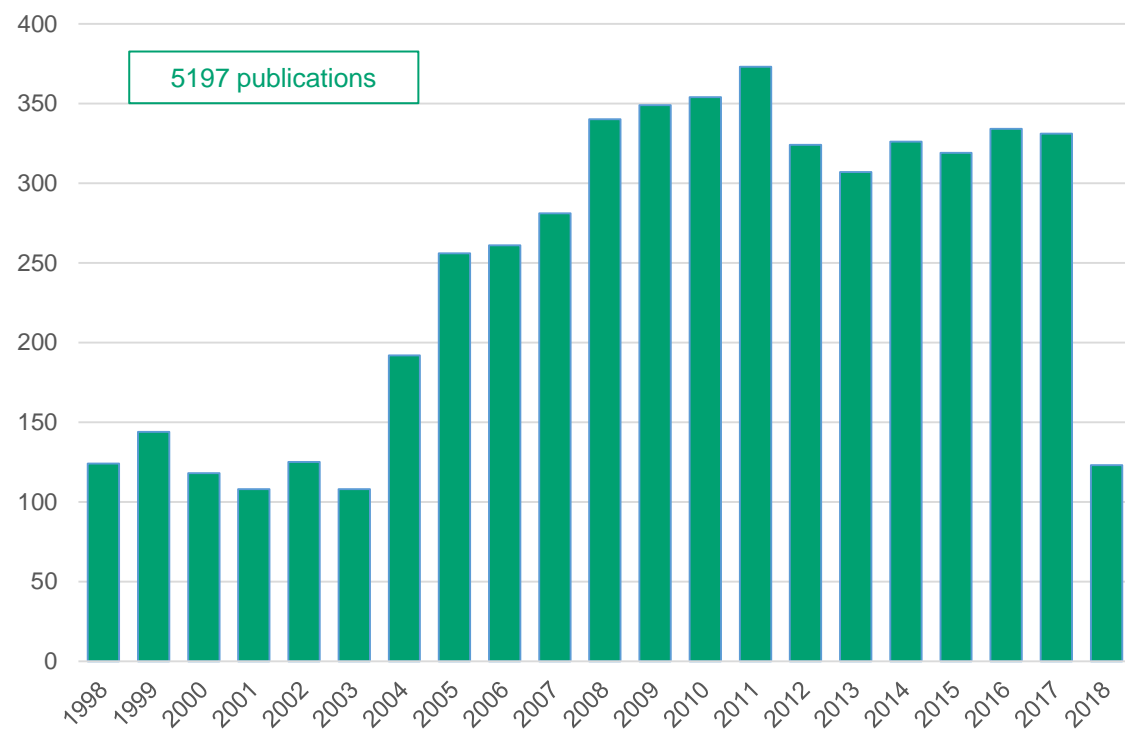

Web of Science – IOCB papers

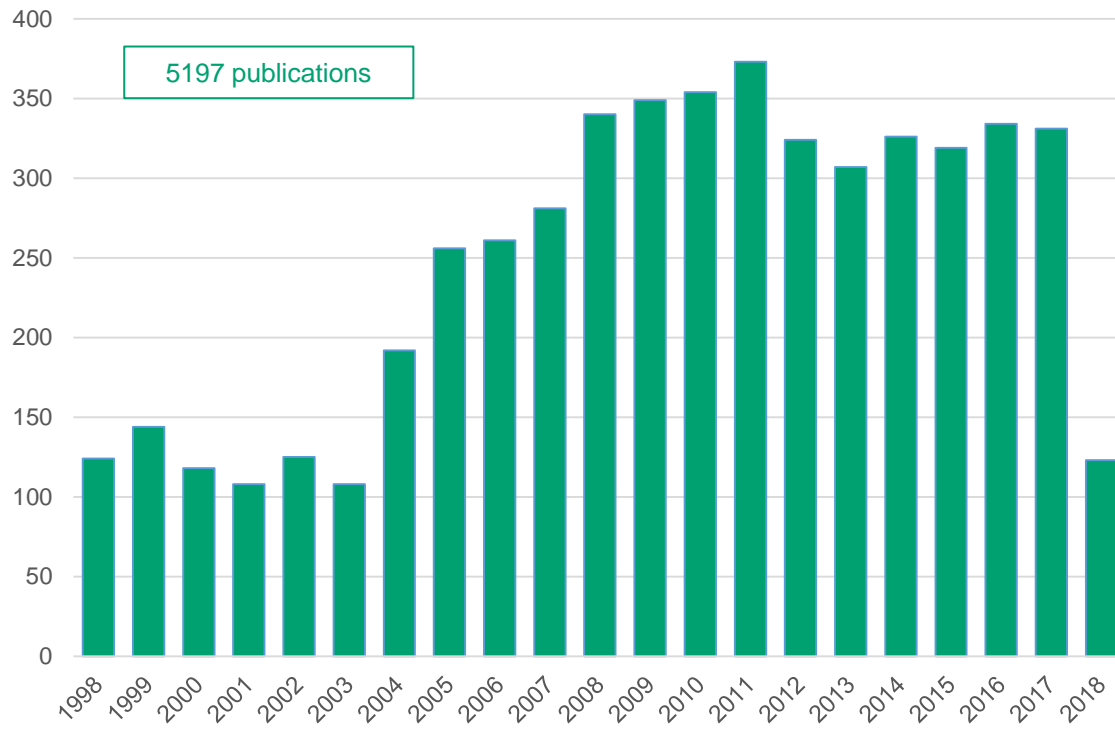

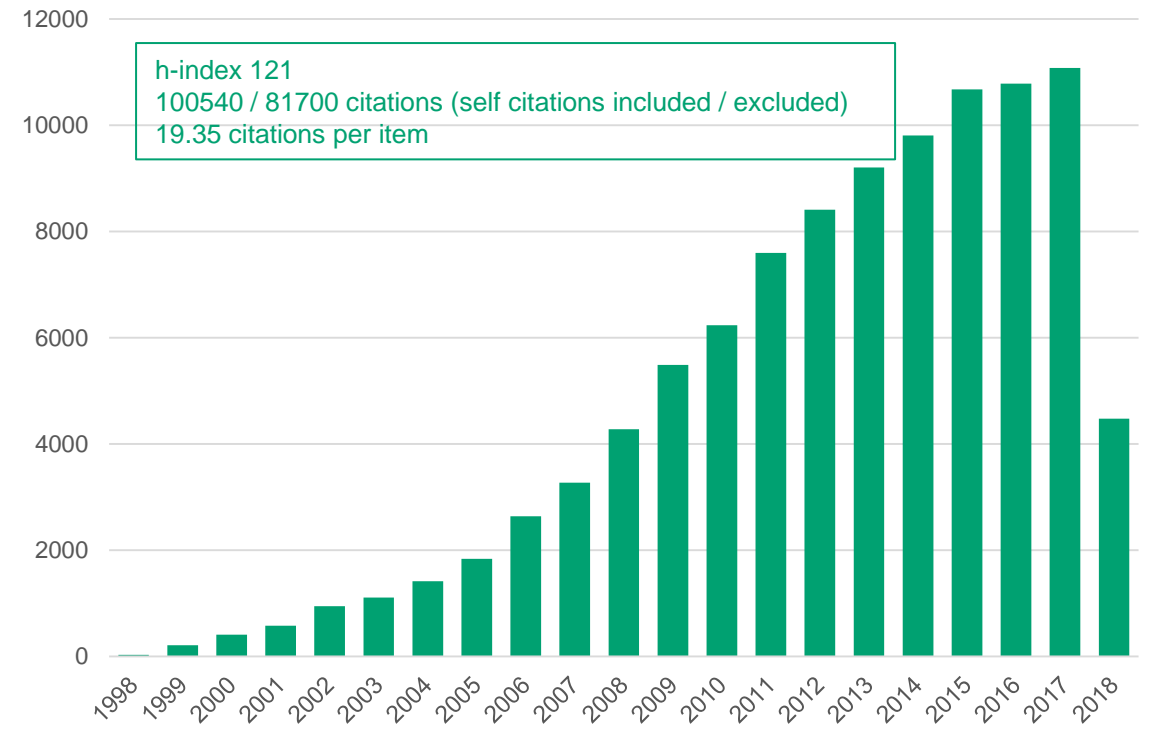

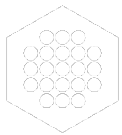
Web of Science – IOCB citations

- Please contact Mrs. Šišková (Economic dept., foreign business trips), ideally one week in advance

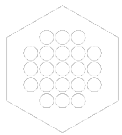


Compliance with Internal Deadlines, Guidelines and Directives

- Grant Projects Proposals
 - Draft Contracts
 - Purchase Orders via e-mails

- Requirements for administrative processing(s) have tendencies to increase – more time is required to process any proposal;
 - Tougher penalties for simplest administrative omission(s);
 - Every Purchase Order needs to be made via Purchase Department - Purchase Orders via a-mail made without participation of Purchase Department may not be deductible expense of grant (especially OP VVV) due to subsequent administrative obligations that cannot be fulfilled.
 - Please, bear in mind, that every Draft of Contract takes approximately 10-14 days to process.
