This internship may be divided in two shorter parts; this is to be described and explained in the project proposal form part A and D1.

In the four years prior to their application, applicants should have spent at least **two consecutive years** outside the country in which they are planning to establish their laboratory.

The PI must have already shown **research independence** and evidence of maturity by having produced at least one important publication as main author or without the participation of his/her PhD supervisor.

Researchers from TC incoming to the CR need

- 1) Long-term residence permits for researchers** (max 2y) or
- 2) Long-term visas for researchers** (max 1y)

With this residence permit / visum researchers can freely travel in Schengen area and make a short-term research visits up to 3 months in other Schengen countries. If researchers want to work in other EU country for more than 3 months they have to apply and get residence permit or visum for this specific country.
