Call info	The EMBO Long-Term Fellowships are awarded for a period of up to two years and support post-doctoral research visits to laboratories throughout Europe and the world. International exchange is a key feature in the application process.
Conditions / Restrictions	Applicant must hold a <b>PhD degree</b> or equivalent at the start of the fellowship, at the latest. The PhD degree must have been obtained during the two years prior to the application deadline (10 Aug 2017 – 31 Dec 2019/30 Jun 2020). Exceptions to this rule are made for applicants with prolonged career breaks due to parental leave, etc Applicant must have at least <b>one first (or joint first) author research paper</b> accepted for publication or published in an international peer reviewed journal at the time the application is complete (Fri 09 Aug 2019). Application must involve a <b>change of country</b> . Applicant can apply if he/she has already started working in the host laboratory, but only if he/she has been working there for less

	<p>than <b>six months</b> at the time the application deadline (10 Feb 2019 – 09 Aug 2019). Do NOT indicate the journal impact factor. EMBO is a signatory of DORA, <a href="http://www.ascb.org/dora">www.ascb.org/dora</a></p> <p>Applicant needs to register for an EMBO online application account. Once login details for the account have been received it is possible to start an application. Figures and tables cannot be included in the application.</p> <p>Applicant may only submit <b>one application</b>, for one project, at one host laboratory at each round of selection. Reapplication is permitted only once.</p> <p>Applicant should list and activate <b>two referees</b> and the receiving institute contact person as soon as possible, preferably 4 weeks prior to the deadline. It is responsibility of the applicant to check that the referees and the receiving institute have received the request and complete the form.</p> <p>It is the applicant's responsibility to arrange the interview with the interviewer and to make sure they have all required documents in order before they travel. Applicant may be requested to give a seminar as part of the interview procedure.</p> <p>Fellowships are awarded to candidates and not host institutions.</p>
