A lump sum towards the travel costs of marital partners and children under the age of 18 accompanying the award winner may be granted if they stay with the award winner in Germany for at least 6 months. 50% of the lump sum will be paid for children between 2–11, 10% for children < the age of 2. Extensive alumni sponsorship once a successful research stay has come to an end.

Call info	Humboldt Research award is granted in recognition of a researcher's entire achievements to date to academics whose fundamental discoveries, new theories, or insights have had a significant impact on their own discipline and who are expected to continue producing cutting-edge achievements in the future. Award winners are invited to spend a period of up to 1 year cooperating on a long-term research project with specialist colleagues at a research institution in Germany.
Conditions / Restrictions	The Humboldt Research Award can only be granted once to any one academic. Researchers who have already received a research award for their academic achievements from the Humboldt Foundation are not eligible to be nominated. Furthermore, the nominee should not have recently won any awards or fellowships in Germany for his or her academic accomplishments. At the time of nomination, the nominated candidate must have been predominantly living and working abroad for at least <b>5 years</b> . Moreover, the nominees must not have held or accepted an offer of permanent employment in Germany prior to the selection date. Nominating academics must guarantee that they can provide the necessary infrastructure for the award winner's own research projects or lecture tours (e.g. access to libraries, materials, facilities). German hosts are also expected to be well prepared for the award winner's research stay and to act as his or her personal mentor (e.g. finding accommodation).

Evaluation criteria	<p>The nominee's outstanding academic qualification must be internationally recognised and documented by corresponding successes in research, such as positively received academic publications or previous awards.</p> <p>1) Previous outstanding academic achievements,</p> <p>2) Fundamental discoveries, new theories or findings that have had a lasting effect on the nominee's discipline beyond their immediate research area (international impact),</p> <p>3) The nominee's previous body of work as a whole,</p> <p>4) The expectation of further outstanding achievements in the future.</p>
