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IAB report - methodology

Two members of the IAB solicited independently 2-3 letters of recommendation for each Group Leader, and anonymized versions of these letters were provided before the meeting. It must be emphasized that these letters should be considered as supplementary only, since a major part of the review process was to evaluate not only whether the performance of Group Leaders was simply satisfactory, but also how they would compare with their peers in high-quality scientific institutions elsewhere, and, most importantly, how their research programs fit into the overall mission of the IOCB and how successful they were in creating value-added interactions with other IOCB groups. That aspect of the evaluation was largely performed by the IAB members with input from the IOCB management, and thus the final recommendations may differ from those provided by the individual outside reviewers. In this context a crucial aspect of the evaluation was convincing the IAB members about the biological significance and potential applications rather than only about methodological advances.

IAB report - recommendations

This report ranks the Junior Research Group leaders in the order of enthusiasm elicited by their written reports, presentations in person, ability to answer the questions and formulate clear future research plans, as well as by the comments of the external reviewers. It is the hope of the IAB that it will assist the management of the IOCB in making the final decisions regarding promotion of the Group Leaders.

Evaluation results

Based on the written report from the IAB from Oct. 4, 2019, the following decisions have been made by the IOCB director:

- Kvido Stříšovský and Robert Hanus groups have been promoted to Senior Groups.
- Milan Vrábel and Ed Curtis groups have been extended as Junior Groups for two more years.
 - Norbert Weiss, Josef Lazar and Dmytro Yushchenko groups have not been promoted to Senior Groups and are therefore being terminated.

IAB report – Recommendations 2

Overall, none of the four would be "above the bar" for an assistant professor position at a quality institution in the US or Europe. Not one showed an instinct to generate research ideas sufficiently removed from their postdoc and/or graduate work, and none demonstrated an awareness of the importance of placing their research ideas within a larger thematic scientific goal. They presented fairly minor proposals to explore research projects that incrementally modified what they had already done as postdocs and graduate students. The IAB seriously doubts that any of these projects could be fundable in the ERC system. None of these four candidates came across as "compelling, must have hires". From among the four, Mark Maturi gave the "best" presentation, but he is still below the bar. He might be encouraged to reformulate his project and re-apply in a year or so, however without any promise as to the result. Marta Meazza has certainly been very productive, but productivity is necessary but not sufficient to qualify for a junior level position at an institution reaching towards excellence. She needs much scientific maturing and mentoring to expand her research ideas well beyond what she has explored in her recent positions. Even if she claims the research projects and ideas were her own, they were rather trivial and incremental.

On that basis the IAB recommends taking no action and re-advertising for next season, perhaps with input on applications from a subset of members of the IAB.

Job interviews follow up

 A renewed targeted search for an accomplished synthetic organic chemist, to strengthen this core discipline at IOCB, will be the focus for the next year's call
