Call info	FEBS Long-Term Fellowships are awarded to support long-term postdoctoral visits in FEBS countries for the purpose of scientific collaboration or advanced training in biochemistry and molecular biology. Fellowships are originally granted for 1 year and may be renewed for a further year up to a maximum of three years.
Conditions / Restrictions	The application process is handled via online application system: <u>https://fellowships.febs.org/lt_2020</u> Applicants need to be members of a FEBS Constituent Society (e.g. the Czech Society for Biochemistry and Molecular Biology, <u>www.csbmb.cz</u>), to be working in a laboratory in a FEBS country (for at least 1 year) and to be seeking to work in a laboratory in a different FEBS country. Applicants who are already working at the host institute are eligible for LTF if the length of the stay does not exceed 9 months at the closing date of the call. Applicants must have a PhD completed less than 3 years prior to the application deadline (extension for a justified career breaks) Former holders of a LTF may not apply for another LTF, whereas former holders of a STF or a CDS may apply for a LTF if the previous fellowship was completed more than 12 months prior to the date of application for a LTF.

Proposal consists of	 Applicants are not allowed to be funded by other grants except of additional top-up funds of the host institutions in cases where the stipend granted is below the minimum income for a postdoctoral researcher defined by law in the host country. The FEBS Fellowship should be acknowledged in any work published relating to the project funded and a reprint of each article should be sent electronically to the Chairperson of the Fellowships Committee. By acceptance of a FEBS Fellowship, senior or recently completed FEBS Long-Term Fellows are expected to attend one FEBS Fellows Meeting preceding the annual FEBS Congress, upon invitation from the FEBS Fellowships Chair. During the tenure of the Fellowship or after its completion, Fellows may apply for a FEBS Distinguished Young Investigator Award or a grant from the FEBS Fellowship Follow-up Research Fund.
