Call info	The Eiffel grant program is financed and managed by France's Ministry of Foreign
	Affairs and International Development (MAEDI). Designed to help French higher
	education institutions attract the best possible applicants to MSc programs and
	PhD internship in the face of stiff international competition.
Conditions / Restrictions	The program is designed for foreign nationals. Candidates who hold French
	citizenship, even if they are also a citizen of another country, are not eligible.
	Knowledge of French language is requested in level sufficient for the studies.
	Applicants for master studies may request two additional months for language
	courses Grantees must complete 75% of their curriculum in France.
	Applications are put forward by the French host institutions, which agree to enrol
	the grantees in the program for which they are selected.
	The Eiffel program does not cover tuition.
	Recipients of grants from the French government are exempted from paying the
	application and registration fees charged by public institutions.  An application nominating a student rejected in a previous competition will not be
	accepted, even if the application was submitted by a different institution or in
	another field of study.
	Students who have previously received an Eiffel master's or doctoral scholarship
	are not eligible to receive another at the master's level. Institutions may nominate
	1 and the single to receive another at the macter of level, motivations may normate

	for a doctoral scholarship a candidate previously awarded a scholarship at the
	master's level.
	Master level: Candidates already studying in France are ineligible.
	Doctoral level: Students enrolled in academic programs abroad have priority over
	students already in France.
	Each institution may nominate a maximum of 40 applicants at the master's level.
	Applicants nominated by more than one institution will be immediately rejected.
	Applications submitted directly by students or by foreign educational
	institutions will be rejected.
Proposal consists of	1st step:
	- You have to choose by yourself the French institution according to your project of
	study. Any French higher education institution can apply
	- You may contact the International Relations department of the university/school
	trough their website, by email or phone, to know the deadline for the submission of
	applications.
	2nd step:
	- If your French university/school has decided to support your application to the
	Eiffel scholarship, they will send you the application form and help you fill it out.
	- Finally, they will send the application on your behalf.
	Applications are submitted by the French host institutions, which agree to
	enrol the grantees in the program for which they are selected.
Evaluation criteria	The selection process will be carried out by a committee composed of four panels
Evaluation ontona	of experts, one for each field of study. The members of these panels will not
	evaluate applications from institutions with which they are affiliated.

	- The applicant's record of excellence
	- The institution's international policy
	- The aid partnership policy of the French ministry of foreign affairs
