Call info	JSPS Invitational Short-term Fellowships (JSPS S) invite overseas researchers with excellent records of research achievements for short-term visits to Japan and provide them opportunities for discussions, opinion exchanges, lectures and other activities.
Conditions / Restrictions	Host researchers must be eligible to apply for a KAKENHI grant-in-aid and his/her affiliated institution must judge them able to implement the project and to provide an appropriate research environment (e.g., laboratory, equipment, personnel) for it. Fellows are researchers who (i) hold a full-time position in an overseas research institution, (ii) are in a position equivalent to a university professor, associate professor or assistant professor, (iii) are citizens or a permanent residents of a country that has diplomatic relations with Japan, (iv) researchers of Japanese nationality residing overseas must have lived in the other country for at least 10 years and been actively engaged in research in that country throughout the period. Applications must be submitted to JSPS by a host researcher in Japan via the head of his/her university or institution. Each host institution has to confirm the application list on the electronic application system by the deadline. Each host institution has to submit two types of documents in

	paper by the deadline: (i) List of applications, (ii) List of applicants. Fellows are not permitted to receive other fellowships or funding (e.g. salary or other compensation) during the tenure of their fellowships. Fellows are not allowed to receive per diem even when they are provided funds for transportation and accommodation during trips to execute their research plans. During the tenure, fellows must devote full time to their research at their host institutions, and not engage in any other work or research. Fellows must, as a rule, reside in Japan continuously during the term of their fellowships, and leave Japan on the expiration date of their tenure. The fellowship period – i.e from the day a fellow coming from abroad arrives at an airport in Japan (the day the fellowship starts), to the day that the fellow departs from an airport in Japan (the day the fellowship ends); except of fellows who reside in Japan befor/after fellowship period. It is JSPS's policy to provide open access to research papers (see JSPS open-access implementation policy https://www.jsps.go.jp/data/Open_access.pdf/ in Japanese, and JSPS Research fellowships guidelines (English))

Evaluation criteria	 Collaboration will contribute to advancing science in Japan and the counterpart country. Collaboration can be expected to advance research in the subject field. Evaluation should place emphasis on researchers invited from other countries. The applicant (host researcher) and candidate have established contact in advance and created a concrete activity plan. The host institution has adequately prepared a system for receiving the candidate. The plan can be carried out within the period of the candidate's fellowship tenure. The plan has as its objective lectures, discussions or other exchange activities held not only in the host institution but also in some other institutions. That the plan also includes instructive opportunities to foster young researchers. As much as possible, unbalance should avoid in the selectees' nationalities, host institutions and areas of specialisation. Not only the score of the document review but also the examiners' reasons and comments are to be given adequate consideration. The number of selectees with Japanese nationality is no more than about 3% of all the selectees under one recruitment for an application period.
