Focused on	International collaborative, interdisciplinary and cutting-edge basic research in the life sciences. HFSPO promotes new interdisciplinary research collaborations across the world. Research Grants - Early Career All team members are expected to direct a research group (for no longer than 5 years) and must
	have a doctoral degree (PhD, MD or equivalent) – up to 10 years before the deadline for submission of the LOI. They must be in a position to initiate and direct their own independent lines of research. "Postdocs" are not eligible to apply.
	The HFSP award is not intended to create scientific independence; this is a decision of the research institute prior to the application. Applicants should clearly list periods of parental leave (or similar) in the CV giving start and end as well as the number of months to benefit from an extension of the eligibility criteria. <b>Research Grants - Program</b>
	Awarded to teams of independent researchers at any stage of their careers. The research team is expected to develop new lines of research through the collaboration. Applications including independent investigators early in their careers are encouraged.
PI	The PI representing the international team must be located in one of the HFSPO countries: Australia, Austria, Belgium, Bulgaria, Canada, Croatia, Cyprus (EU part), the Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, India, the Republic of Ireland, Israel, Italy, Japan, the Republic of Korea, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, the Netherlands, New Zealand, Norway, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Singapore, Slovakia, Slovenia, South Africa, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, the United Kingdom, and the United States of America. Co-Applicants can be located in any country.
Eligible organisation	The PI must be working at a non-profit academic institution. The team may include members from for-profit organizations if their expertise is necessary for the project. However, such team members may not receive any funds and will not be considered in calculating the amount of award.
Target group	Consortium of 2–4 team members. Teams of scientists from different countries who wish to combine their expertise in innovative approaches to questions that could not be answered by individual laboratories. Different branches or campuses of the same university (e.g., NYU in New York and Shanghai) or organization (e.g., EMBL or MPI) are counted as the same affiliation. Clear priority will be given to intercontinental collaborations. Teams with 2 members from the same institution are not eligible to apply.

Reporting	A financial report based on lists of all expenditures from the HFSPO award will be required for the full three years of the award, organised by the PI at the end of the grant. PI must submit final Scientific Report to HFSPO on behalf of the whole team. In addition, all invoices, pay-slips, etc. must be retained for at least two years after the end of the grant period in case of audit. Reporting practices may be subject to modification during tenure of the grant if required by the HFSPO Board of Trustees or auditors

The HFSP budget is determined in US dollars. <b>Equipment</b> : purchase of equipment must be essential for the new collaboration which is proposed <b>Materials and supplies</b> : costs of reagents, animals, disposables, computer software necessary for the scientific collaboration <b>Services</b> : consulting services and computer services specific to the project, rental fees
Salaries: only for research assistants (post-doctoral scientists, graduate students, technicians) essential for the new collaborative project, no salary for PIs, Co-PIs, students fees, institutional staff
<b>Communication expenses:</b> publications (incl. Open access), article translations, mail, express courier services
<b>Travel and per diem:</b> for team members and their personnel visiting other team members, HFSP trainings and meetings
<b>Indirect costs (overheads):</b> up to 10% of the direct costs of the award
The research institutions must provide the facilities and equipment necessary for members to carry
out their proposed research. A <b>budget proposal is not required</b> at any stage of the application

2025 HFSP Research Grants
HFSP Research Grants support <b>innovative basic research</b> into fundamental biological problems with emphasis placed on <b>novel and interdisciplinary approaches</b> that involve scientific exchanges across national and disciplinary boundaries. HFSP Research Grants are team grants providing financial support to the team for three years. The amount paid depends only on team composition.
• Scientists applying for a HFSP research grant must be organized as an international research team (with emphasis on <b>intercontinental collaborations</b> ).
Applications from individual researchers are not eligible.
The HFSP research team may include 2 to 4 members
<ul> <li>A proposal from a team with three or four members where two team members have their laboratories in the same country is eligible if the team can demonstrate that this collaboration is essential to maintain the frontier and interdisciplinary character of the proposed research.</li> <li>All team members must have a research doctoral degree (PhD, MD or equivalent) and must</li> </ul>
<ul><li>lead a research group (however small).</li><li>All team members must be in the position to determine the course of the HFSP-funded project</li></ul>
<ul> <li>and have freedom to administer the awarded grant. "Post-docs" are not eligible.</li> <li>Team members are expected to work in different disciplines and have their labs in different</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>countries.</li> <li>Secondary affiliations will be considered to determine eligibility of a team – i.e. a team of two</li> </ul>
members is not eligible if one of them has a secondary affiliation in the country where the other member works.
<ul> <li>Two members from the same country have to clearly bring different disciplines to the project.</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>No individual may be an applicant on more than one letter of intent in the same review round.</li> <li>Those who currently hold an HFSP research grant (as Principal Applicants or Co-Applicants, even during any no-cost extension) are not eligible to apply for a second research grant.</li> <li>Awardees from 2020 and 2021 may apply for a new grant if it starts after termination of the current award, they must provide information about the objectives and outcome of the former project, together with a statement of its relationship to the current application.</li> <li>Awardees must observe the highest ethical standards in conducting all research supported by the Program - all team members have to agree to conform strictly to the national and</li> </ul>

Evaluation criteria	<ul> <li>Novelty: i.e. projects that challenge existing paradigms by using novel approaches and techniques. To stimulate daring ideas and innovative approaches which entail risks, preliminary results are not required in research grant applications.</li> <li>Teams of scientists: HFSP supports teams of normally 2-4 scientists. Team members should not have collaborated before, they will normally not have published original research together, and the project must be significantly different from their ongoing research.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Scientific merit: Projects should be potentially transformative in addressing important fundamental problems at the frontiers of the life sciences, or barriers to progress in the life sciences.</li> <li>Internationality: i.e. novel international, preferably intercontinental collaborations that involve scientific exchanges across national boundaries.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Interdisciplinarity: The participation of scientists from disciplines outside the traditional life sciences such as physics, chemistry, computational biology, computer science, engineering, mathematics, nanoscience or psychology is highly encouraged.</li> <li>Early career scientists: The HFSP places special emphasis on encouraging scientists early in their careers – this is expressed both in a special scheme for Early Career scientists and in encouraging scientists early in their careers to participate in the Program Grants.</li> </ul>
	• The collaboration between <b>all team members must be absolutely necessary</b> to achieve the aims of the project.
Research areas	Biological functions at all levels of analysis: for example - studies on genes and individual molecules, intracellular networks, intercellular association in tissues and organs, and networks underlying the complex functions of entire organisms, populations, or ecosystems.
