Most significant publications

Each group leader can submit two papers published by his/her group in year 2024 to compete in the three cluster categories: CHEM, BIO or PHYS. Only papers that have been published in (i.e. their citation includes 2024 as the year in which they have been published), are eligible.

nominations will be collected through interactive list of eligible publications

 distributed by email by the IOCB library



- call for the nominations will be announced by email in week 5, 2025
- deadline for nominations: February 18th

Most significant publications are selected by external international panel of reviewers and the IOCB director. Internal vote within the institute isorganized as well. Overall 3.5M CZK will be distributed to the authors. Publications will be presented as posters at the annual retreat 2026.

Mentoring for PhD students at IOCB

What is it?

Mentoring is a relationship in which a person with more experience supports another person to help them develop skills, knowledge, and experience they need to progress in the direction that they want to go.

Why?

The need arose from IOCB PhD students survey (presented at October GLM)

Who will be IOCB mentors?

- IOCB scientists currently supervising PhD students (currently 59 colleagues)
- mentor has option to accept or decline the mentee
- however management kindly ask mentors to accept this duty and help the IOCB & students

How it will work?

- organized by PhD coordinator expect email with details and guidelines
- student chooses mentor through application similar to PhD and SSP application process
- if mentor accepts, both will organize individual meetings as needed (min. 1x per year)
- optional, informal, no bureaucracy

- Step 2: Select group results (publications) according to calculated FTE quota (HR/Research Support will provide)
- Step 3: Prepare additional descriptive information for selected results
